the elegance of elizabeth anne jones poems can be found in such lines as one feels beauty and knows when one is near a rose but

wind moves petals and tugs at leaves in a trembling tree it moves me or in her poem about old goats their small hooves tapping spritely songs of clippy clapping there are many voices in her poetry like the village women of punjab who sit kerchiefs of faded scraps tied across their lower faces to ward off evil germs and finally in her poem the dark she writes a lute sings softly where i live a table some fruit a chair she invites us into her poems please come inside her poems have been published in various periodicals books of poetry and orally on audio cd s they have also won many prizes she became a serious poet in 1978 while she was working on her masters degree in poetry at the university of hawaii where she studied under such well known poets as james wright who won a pulitzer prize for his collected works and john logan she felt privileged to have had a course in research with leon edel whose biography of henry james won him a pulitzer prize he told us that if we ever published a book to mention him because it would give the book more clout then there was elizabeth mccutcheon a gifted teacher whose courses in early 17th century poetry were inspired and inspiring we never got done reading her handouts it was a wonderful climate for poets and as a gardener anne would say that the potting soil was of the highest order

robinson jeffers 1887 1962 is not only the greatest poet that california and indeed the american west has produced but a major poet of the twentieth century who occupies a prominent place in the tradition of american prophetic poetry jeffers consciously set himself apart from the poetry of his generation by physical isolation at his home in carmel by his unusual poetic form and by his stance as an anti modernist yet his work represents a profound and profoundly original artistic response to problems that shaped modernist poetry and that still perplex poets today how to reconcile scientific and artistic discourses and modes of vision how to connect present day experience to myths perceived as lying at the origins of human culture how to renew the poetic language and how or whether to present art s claim to moral spiritual or epistemological seriousness within representations of modern phenomena for jeffers as for no other important modern american poet there has never been a collected poems not even a truly representative selected poems the current selected poetry first published in 1938 contains no work from the last three volumes published during jeffers lifetime or from his posthumous volume now for the first time all of jeffers completed poems both published and unpublished are presented in a single comprehensive and textually authoritative edition the first three volumes of this four volume work will present chronologically all of jeffers published work from 1920 to 1963 the present volume consists of poems published between 1920 and 1928 and includes some of his greatest and best known poems tamar roan stallion the women at point sur and cawdor as well as a recently discovered long poem home there is also an editorial note and a general introduction

anything goes is a compilation of my feelings and observations of the world around me by the use of poems plays and essays it

expresses my personal views of what is what should be and what is wished for to come about

mainstream american poetry of the 1950s has long been dismissed as deliberately indifferent to its cultural circumstances in this penetrating study edward brunner breaks the placid surface of the hollow decade to reveal a poetry sharply responsive to issues of its time cold war poetry considers the fifties poem as part of a dual cultural project as proof of the competency of the newly professionalized poet and as a user friendly way of initiating a newly educated upwardly mobile postwar audience into high culture brunner revisits richard wilbur randall jarrell and other acknowledged leaders of the period as well as neglected writers such as rosalie moore v r lang katherine hoskins melvin b tolson and hyam plutzik he also examines the one sided authority of the male dominated book review process the ostracizing of female and minority poets poetic fads such as the ubiquitous sestina and the power of the classroom anthology to establish criteria for reading attributing the gradual change in poetic style during the 1950s to the slow collapse of the authority of the state brunner shows how a secretive anxious poetics developed in the shadow of a disabled government he recontextualizes the much maligned domestic verse of the 1950s reading its shift toward the private sphere and the recurrent image of the child as a reflection of the powerlessness of the post nuclear citizen through a close examination of poetry written about the bomb he delineates how poets registered their growing sense of cosmic disorder in coded language resorting to subterfuge to continue their critique in the face of sanctions levied against those who questioned government policies brilliantly decoding the politics embedded in the poetry of an ostensibly apolitical time cold war poetry provides a powerful rereading of a pivotal decade
